

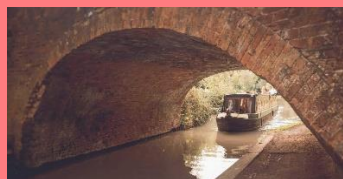
Year 4 Homework Pick and Mix

Get Mathematical

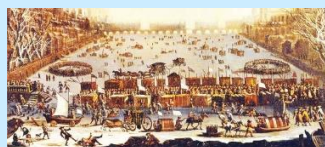
Can you time your journey to school? Does it change depending on your mode of transport?

Many amazing events happen on or near rivers, such as ice fairs in the 18th century. Create a story about an event that happens when the River Thames freezes over.



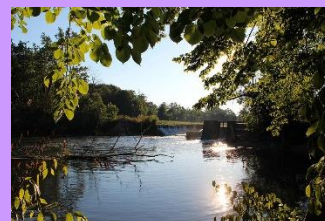
Get Outside
